Annual General Meeting

Almost sixty members turned up at the Club's Annual General Meeting on Friday 28 May 2021. Given that the Club was closed due to COVID-19 for over one month at the end of the last financial year and for the first two months of this financial year, the Club is well and truly on the move again - recording a profit of \$83,966, with \$112,137 in the bank and \$50,034 put aside in a sinking fund towards the cost of the replacement of our synthetic green in due course.

Two special resolutions were approved at the Annual General Meeting as follows:

- Rule 183 (c) of the Constitution was amended such that a special resolution to amend the constitution has to be passed by a majority of not less than threequarters of the members present and entitled to vote. (This is a requirement under the Associations Incorporation Act (Tas.).)
- A new section 119A was added to the Constitution requiring in part that minutes of each Board Meeting are now required to be circulated to each member of the Club who has an email address within seven days of the meeting. A hard copy of the minutes must also be placed on the Club noticeboard within seven days of the meeting.

Members enjoyed nibbles and a drink after the Annual General meeting. Thanks to Providore Paul Evans and his willing group of helpers who arranged the nibbles.

On the Wednesday we had a group of people from very diverse countries come and work in our kitchen. The Migrant Resource Centre are working with THA to offer opportunities for these people. On the Thursday the same group provided soup, sandwiches and garlic bread for our bowlers to enjoy in lieu of payment for use of our kitchen.

Two of the group were offered an opportunity to gain work experience with the Club - Anita assisted with Friday Night Snack Meals and Ni Nah showed Paul Evans and Patricia Zapotocky how to make prawn rice paper rolls with Thursday's bowlers again reaping the rewards.

Grants Update

The Federal Government has provided \$16,500 from its Stronger Communities Program to upgrade our women's toilet and provide a new disabled toilet for the Club. Work will commence shortly on this project.

The Tasmanian Liberal Government has promised \$1 million towards the first stage of the Buckingham Precinct Strategic Plan. This stage will see the conversion of our Green 3 into two netball courts, new fencing to ensure our Club is fully secure, new shade structures around all four sides of Green 2 and synthetic grass to replace the current real grass around the surrounds of Green 2. It is anticipated that work on this stage will commence before the start of next season.

The Tasmanian Liberal Government has also promised the Club \$50,000 for retractable awnings for shade off the Clubhouse for Green 1. The awning will be in place in September 2021.

The Club is also awaiting the outcome of the following grant applications:

- \$7,600 for a new vacuum cleaner / sweeper for our synthetic green.
- \$15,000 towards the cost of installing a solar battery to supplement our current solar panel system.
